This time is an opportunity to be still, seeking to be aware of the presence of God within.

Set aside a time for this practice; prepare yourself, as you might for a usual Sunday morning and remember that there are others from the congregation gathering at the same time as you. There are also many from the church around the globe who are gathering to seek the presence of God as we are. We join with them all.

Prepare a space in the house; find a comfortable chair, light a candle, turn off distracting noises and close the door if that will help you to be still. This is something that does not need to be hurried.

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION:

Today is a celebration of the Spirit and all are welcome to this celebration.

The rhythm of breath – drawing air in, and sighing it out – pulses in all of creation. It is a simple sign of the resurrection; of the life that cannot be quenched, even by death itself. We know what it is to breathe, our lives depend on it even as they depend on Christ, risen, alive and present.

CALL TO WORSHIP:

Come, Holy Spirit , fill the hearts of your people; And kindle in us the fire of your love.

Breathe the Spirit into us, Jesus, and teach us to sing, to worship, with every breath And to live the inspiration that is your resurrection. **Amen.**

PRAYER OF CONFESSION:

In penitence and faith, let us confess our sins to almighty God in a moment of silence.

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Let us pray together:

Merciful God, Our maker and our judge, We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed: We have not loved you with our whole heart, We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves; We repent, and our sorry for all our sins Father, forgive us. Strengthen us to love and obey you in newness of life; Through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen. Hear the assurance of the apostle Paul, "If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation.". Paul proclaims that in Christ, no matter what you have done you are not bound by the past. And so I declare to you Christ's word of forgiveness: Your sins are forgiven.

Thanks be to God.

PASSING OF THE PEACE:

Your Word, Oh Lord, is a lamp to our feet;

A light to our path

John 15:26-27, 16:4a-15 (New Living Translation)

26 "But I will send you the Advocate—the Spirit of truth. He will come to you from the Father and will testify all about me. 27 And you must also testify about me because you have been with me from the beginning of my ministry.

4 Yes, I'm telling you these things now, so that when they happen, you will remember my warning. I didn't tell you earlier because I was going to be with you for a while longer.

5 "But now I am going away to the one who sent me, and not one of you is asking where I am going. 6 Instead, you grieve because of what I've told you. 7 But in fact, it is best for you that I go away, because if I don't, the Advocate won't come. If I do go away, then I will send him to you. 8 And when he comes, he will convict the world of its sin, and of God's righteousness, and of the coming judgment. 9 The world's sin is that it refuses to believe in me. 10 Righteousness is available because I go to the Father, and you will see me no more. 11 Judgment will come because the ruler of this world has already been judged.

12 "There is so much more I want to tell you, but you can't bear it now. 13 When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth. He will not speak on his own but will tell you what he has heard. He will tell you about the future. 14 He will bring me glory by telling you whatever he receives from me. 15 All that belongs to the Father is mine; this is why I said, 'The Spirit will tell you whatever he receives from me.'

Acts 2:1-21 (New Living Translation)

2 On the day of Pentecost all the believers were meeting together in one place. 2 Suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the roaring of a mighty windstorm, and it filled the house where they were sitting. 3 Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each of them. 4 And everyone present was filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in other languages, as the Holy Spirit gave them this ability.

5 At that time there were devout Jews from every nation living in Jerusalem. 6 When they heard the loud noise, everyone came running, and they were bewildered to hear their own languages being spoken by the believers.

7 They were completely amazed. "How can this be?" they exclaimed. "These people are all from Galilee, 8 and yet we hear them speaking in our own native languages! 9 Here we are—Parthians, Medes, Elamites, people from Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus, the province of Asia, 10 Phrygia, Pamphylia, Egypt, and the areas of Libya around Cyrene, visitors from Rome 11 (both Jews and converts to Judaism), Cretans, and Arabs. And we all hear these people speaking in our own languages about the wonderful things God has done!" 12 They stood there amazed and perplexed. "What can this mean?" they asked each other.

13 But others in the crowd ridiculed them, saying, "They're just drunk, that's all!"

14 Then Peter stepped forward with the eleven other apostles and shouted to the crowd, "Listen carefully, all of you, fellow Jews and residents of Jerusalem! Make no mistake about this. 15 These people are not drunk, as some of you are assuming. Nine o'clock in the morning is much too early for that. 16 No, what you see was predicted long ago by the prophet Joel:

17 'In the last days,' God says, 'I will pour out my Spirit upon all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy. Your young men will see visions, and your old men will dream dreams. 18 In those days I will pour out my Spirit even on my servants-men and women alikeand they will prophesy. 19 And I will cause wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth belowblood and fire and clouds of smoke. 20 The sun will become dark, and the moon will turn blood red before that great and glorious day of the Lord arrives. 21 But everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'

HYMN 404 – 'Lord God, the Spirit Blest'

Spirit of light! explore, and chase our gloom away, with lustre shining more and more towards the perfect day: Spirit of truth! alone in life and death our guide; come, Spirit of adoption! now may we be sanctified.

SERMON: 'Celebration and Sadness'

May the meditations of our hearts and our minds be always acceptable in your sight, God our strength and our redeemer.

Amen

In our reading from John's gospel today we are told the disciples are sad that Jesus speaks so openly and frequently of his return to the Father in heaven. Yet Jesus tells them that this is a good thing because when this does happen, he will send the Spirit in his wake. What I would like to show today is that the presence of the Spirit doesn't necessarily make that sadness go away. But the Father and the Son, through the Spirit help us see hope and beauty in the world alongside our sadness. And that's something worth celebrating.

In the verse from John 15 that I'm talking about, Jesus says

"But now I am going away to the one who sent me, and not one of you is asking where I am going. Instead, you grieve because of what I've told you." Another translation puts it even more poetically "Because I have spoken to you, grief has filled your heart".

I think we can all relate to how sad it is to lose someone we feel has had a positive impact on our lives. You might have had a minister that you knew was leaving but you very much wished they could stay.

Think how intensely the disciples would have felt this. Jesus had taught them amazing things, built up a huge following, and shown incredible courage by challenging the authorities on behalf of the poor and the oppressed. They believed their movement would be doomed without his passion and power. Yet here he is telling his disciples he must leave them. They felt abandoned.

But Jesus has something life-giving in store. Jesus says "If I do go away, then I will send [The Spirit] to you. And when he comes, he will convict the world of its sin, and of God's righteousness, and of the coming judgment." We get a bit uncomfortable with talk of sin and judgement but what Jesus is talking about here is not punishment. It's about making the world right by ridding it of evil, injustice and suffering. The Spirit will carry the message to the disciples and beyond that the world is transforming around them.

And this is where we come to the Pentecost story in Acts. Up to then, Jesus had only been able to speak to his own little world of 1st century Palestine. But the Spirit that Jesus sends will bring the good news to the four corners of the world. How so? Well in our Acts reading we hear that a sound like a mighty windstorm filled the house of believers and tongues of fire settled on each of them and all of a sudden they could speak in different languages. In the blink of an eye, the gospel message is understandable to so many more groups of people with their different languages. The Spirit is working in the world.

It all sounds very big and spectacular, doesn't it? And I suppose the story of Pentecost as told in Acts is spectacular. But the Spirit is not about spectacle. The Spirit is life. It infuses everything. And coming from Christ and the Father it gives us meaning and purpose. Often the problem is not that the Spirit is absent. It's that we take it for granted. We don't appreciate that it brings life to all the people and places and experiences we hold dear.

Understandably, we find it difficult to feel the presence of the Spirit in our sickness and sadness. I can't tell you why we live in a world with such pain and suffering. Sometimes, like the disciples, we feel like Jesus has abandoned us. But what I can tell you is that God longs for us to be God's children. We become God's children not simply by believing the right thing or saying the right prayers. Instead, it is through our faith in Christ who sends the Spirit in a way that can transform our hearts. It inspires and empowers us to love the creation given to us by God, even and especially when that creation is suffering.

This Pentecost I hope we can celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the many gifts that flow from it - like church, friends, family, kindness, lovers, beauty, wisdom - insert whatever you feel is life-giving. The sadness that we feel should not be denied but it need not lead to despair. This is because the Spirit is everywhere giving us life.

Perhaps a key out of the prison of our own despair is figuring out how to make the gifts of life available to those less fortunate than ourselves. Visit someone in a nursing home or hospital. Be a good listener to someone who is going through psychological struggles. Offer practical support to someone experiencing financial hardship. But don't just give them sympathy or charity. Show them the beauty of the Spirit by being curious, humorous, open and loving.

It should be liberating to know that sadness and celebration need not be strangers. There is no pressure to live up to a false ideal of never-ending happiness. In a hurting world Christ sends the Spirit of hope and joy. That is abundance and for that we give thanks to God.
